Course Compass will display the top fields of study offered to past applicants with your academic profile. You might be surprised by the results? Or they might confirm the direction you were already thinking of taking. Either way, use these fields of study as a starting point for narrowing your uni options. OTHER EARLY OFFER PROGRAMS

Below are just some of the direct application Early Offer entry programs available through various institutions. You will need to check each institution's website for the application forms ad criteria. Early Offers may be based on academic achievement, leadership or sporting achievement.

Macquarie University Leaders and Achievers Early Entry Scheme

Macquarie recognises that students are individuals with different strengths, interests and personal circumstances, not just their ATAR. Macquarie uses the UAC SRS but also has a Leaders and Achievers Early Entry Scheme that recognises your academic performance and your extracurricular activities beyond the classroom.

If you meet the entry criteria, you're offered a place at Macquarie before your Year 12 results are released.

You're required to provide up to three examples of your involvement in leadership and service during Year 11 or Year 12. This may include voluntary or paid activities you participated in at your school or within your community.

Applications open Monday 1 June 2020 and close Monday 31 August at 2pm. The Contact Centre able to provide application support from 1 May.

Due to the impact of COVID-19, this year, the emphasis is on the student's reflective responses and quality of activities, not the number nor the duration of activities. Other changes include:

- Offers released in Aug, Sep, Oct
- All degrees available except Co-op programs
- Application process fully online
- Teaching degree preferences will need to complete an online questionnaire

University

ACU Community Achievers Program

The Community Achiever Program (CAP) offers future students who are active in their community early offers to their undergraduate course of choice. From regularly volunteering in their community, to representing their school or house in a leadership role, we urge all eligible



students to apply. The CAP provides opportunities to enhance leadership and volunteering skills.

If you're successful you could receive an offer to study with us as early as August. Due to COVID-19 social distancing protocols, ACU understands most people are not able to volunteer right now. Their admissions team will take this into consideration, and students should not let current restrictions deter them from applying.

Applications for the 2021 CAP places will close:

North Sydney - 9th September 2020Strathfield 16th September 2020

University of Sydney - E12 Scheme

The E12 Scheme is available to students through the Educational Access Scheme (EAS) who have experienced financial disruption during their studies. Eligibility for E12 has been extended to include students who attend a rural or regional school in NSW. Successful applicants receive conditional early entry with a lower minimum ATAR and a \$5950 scholarship to support their transition to uni.

2021 Early Offer Program - University of Notre Dame

Notre Dame is pleased to announce its 2021 Early Offer program is now open!

This year's admissions process has been simplified by removing the requirement for an interview. Applicants will still need to provide their Year 11 reports and any available Year 12 reports. The Early Offer program gives Year 12 students the opportunity to receive a Notre Dame offer prior to their HSC exams, providing students with the confidence of knowing they have a place at Notre Dame University in 2021.

If you have a selection rank at or above the published Guaranteed Selection Rank, NSW students will receive an offer to study at UNSW in the UAC December Round 2 (as long as you've ordered your preferences in a way that allows UNSW to make you this offer). ANU Direct Entry - Changes to direct application admissions for 2021

Due to the disruptions caused by COVID-19, ANU have adapted their admissions process for undergraduate study at ANU in 2021.



Direct applications are now open and will close 25 May 2020. You can apply if:

- You will complete your Australian Year 12 studies in 2020
- You will be applying for an undergraduate program that starts in 2021.

Offers will now will be made based on Year 11 results on 10 August 2020, and these will be honoured for study in 2021 as long as students have completed Year 12. Applications open for the Charles Sturt Advantage early offer program on June 1.CSU's early offer program looks at the skills students will need to thrive in the future workplace – things like empathy, resilience and commitment. Offer to study are made before the HSC exams. Students can <u>register their interest now.</u>



UNE Direct Early Entry

UNE Early Entry is open to all year 12 applicants and relies solely on your school's assessment of your attributes and abilities to work and learn independently, as well as your overall potential for academic success at UNE.

Because UNE doesn't need to wait to receive your ATAR, you can apply to UNE early, receive an offer and secure a place at university, by early November even before scores are released. This gives you the certainty you need to begin making other arrangements such as where to live and finding part-time work to get ahead of the pack.

Southern Cross University STAR Early Offer Program

Southern Cross University offers three different entry programs to assist students reach the undergraduate program of choice. Like other early entry programs, the STAR Early Offer program plays a significant role in addressing the uncertainty surrounding the effects of covid-19 by supporting students' transitions from school to university.

STAR Platinum - Students who qualify at this level have unlimited access to any Southern Cross University degree including; Midwifery*, Education, Engineering, and Law. *Midwifery entry is subject to written selection criteria and a competitive interview process.STAR Entry - Students who qualify at this level of the program have access to all Southern Cross University degrees, excluding Midwifery, Education, Engineering, and Law. STAR Pathway - This program provides an access point to students whom for whatever reason may not have gained the academic outcome they had hoped for, but still desire to go to university. If recommended for Preparing for Success (PSP) or Transition to Uni (TU), they will receive a conditional offer for a university degree based on completion of either of these pathway programs.



Fee-Free Apprenticeships are a great way for students to launch their careers

There's never been a better time to start an apprenticeship in NSW. The NSW Government is paying the course cost for 100,000 new apprenticeships – meaning apprentices undertaking a government funded apprenticeship no longer face a student fee of up to \$2000.

Apprenticeships are a great career pathway. They combine on-the-job training with classroom study to give you the skills and experience employers are looking for. Apprenticeships generally take around 3-4 years to complete, and apprentices earn a salary while they learn.

TRADES

Thinking of a career as an Electrician?

Check out NECA's Mathematics practise tests that give you an understanding of the importance of Math in this trade.

To be an electrician you have to be able to make calculations relating to electrical design. It is important to have a good understanding of sums, algebra, geometry and trigonometry. Working with electrical equipment and cabling can be hazardous when miscalculations occur.

- Geometry comes into play when calculating cross sectional areas of cables
- Algebra is used when calculating current (Amps) and electrical loads.
- Trigonometry comes into play when you start to look at capacitance and magnetism.
