History Terracotta Warrior Making - Year 7A



She currently lives with our School Administration Manager who home boards her and drops her off at the centre on her way to work, Misty trains at the centre during the day and is collected in the afternoon after school finishes. Misty is due to graduate this week and, as she is tagged to be matched with a sight impaired student who attends a high school, she came into work to see how she handled a day in a school. She attended 4 classes and as you can see from the photo she was extremely well behaved, was not distracted with the level of noise or movement of students and followed all instructions perfectly.

Careers

Positive Paws

Despite having their Positive Paws volunteering drastically curtailed by extremely hot weather, smoke, and the 'catastrophic' closure of many schools last month, Term Four's student group pulled out all stops to make up for lost time at Guide Dogs, Glossodia. The students were able to interact with older dogs which gave them a better understanding of just how important their patience and skill is when training excitable puppies.

This gave them the opportunity to see the distinct differences in each dog's personality and ability. It soon became very apparent why each dog is matched closely with its new owner and why there is a distinction between guide, assistance, or therapy dogs. At the end of the volunteer sessions, many of the students had picked out their particular 'favourite' based on their personal interactions with the dogs.

Leadership qualities, as always, showed through and next term's mentors will be named at a special graduation early in the New Year, in lieu of this term's cancelled one. Positive Paws has proven to be a great boost to students' communication, confidence, teamwork and leadership skills as well as awareness of volunteering and social responsibility, and, the many careers available within the Animal industry.



Careers Market 2020

The date has already been added to the school calendar so make sure June 2nd is marked on yours. This increases engagement in their learning and exploration of careers and makes decisions for transitioning into future training pathways and employment easier.

Downloading a Year 10 Record of Student Achievement (RoSA)

Students in Years 10, 11 and 12 need to create a NESA account to gain access to their Student Online account. The account is used to access certificates such as Record of Student Achievement(ROSA), Preliminary Record of Student Achievement (Year 11), Higher School Certificate (HSC) and grades such as HSC results, or Minimum Standards, it also provides study information and Examination timetables. Most students have already activated their NESA Students Online accounts and created their six digit access PINs.

How to log on:

Open the NESA student's online site: https://studentsonline.nesa.nsw.edu.au/

- The login section has an "activate your account now" link; use this when first accessing the site.
- Select Colo High from the drop down menu, then fill in your student details and submit.
- A notification stating your NESA number will appear this number is vitally important as it will provide access to the account and it will be used to submit any material for the HSC. Save it somewhere that is safe and readily available.
- Having completed these steps an email will be automatically sent to the student's Department of Education email account. The next step is to open the student email account, Striving for locate the sent email and click on the activation link.

Student Department of Education email accounts are in the form:

firstname.lastname.possiblyanumber@education.nsw.gov.au and the password is the same one that is used to access school computers.

Once you have completed your login click on the My Account tab and Results Services, then follow the prompts to access and print your eROSA. Please note that access via the Department portal is only available until the 30th June 2020.

Many students will decide to move on from school. If this is the case, please remember that until a student is 17 year old, they must be in one of the following in NSW:

TAFE Enrolment – Full time

Students wanting to enrol in TAFE must take a printed copy of their RoSA eligibility with them. A screenshot will not be accepted. Please note that the school does not issue any other paperwork. You will need to provide the school with proof of enrolment (e.g. an invoice) in a full time course as well as written parent permission before you can be signed out of school.

Apprenticeships

Many students gain apprenticeships during the school holidays. Before you can be placed on a TAFE roll to complete your apprenticeship certification requirements, you must be taken off the school roll. You cannot be on two rolls at once. You will need to provide the school with:

- a Letter of Support from a parent/guardian stating they are happy for you to accept the apprenticeship
- a Letter of Offer form the business with their Australian Business Number
- a Training NSW Apprenticeship/Traineeship contract this is a thirteen page document that is signed by the student, a parent or guardian, the employer and the Training NSW representative. A Training Plan often accompanies this but it is not sufficient on its own. This is to ensure that the letter of offer has been formalised with the same apprenticeship certification as stated in the offer.

Full Time Employment

The minimum number of hours classified as full time employment is 25 hours per week. Again, written Parent or Guardian permission is required as well as a letter from the Employer, clearly stating the position to be held, the minimum number of hours to be worked, and the pay award. This is to protect students from unscrupulous employers and ensure that it is in the best interest of the student.

Part Time TAFE Study/ Part Time Employment.

Students can combine these to maintain the 25 hours minimum as long as all of the above paperwork is completed.

Exiting students are also required to have an Exit interview with the Careers Adviser, before they are signed out of school.

To assist families purchase devices, Colo has tearned up to HP to offer a range of suitable devices and peripherals at a heavily discounted price. All devices offered at Colo's HP Store meet the requirements of our BYOD policy.

A summary of these minimum standards are:

- · Windows or Mac Laptop format. (No Android or iOS devices.)
- Screen size: 11.6"
- RAM: 4GB
- Hard Drive: 128GB

N.B. There is no need to purchase any 3rd party software, as all required software will be provided by the Department of Education at no cost. E.G. Office 365, Adobe Creative Suite.
