

ANTI-BULLYING PLAN 2022

Colo High School

Bullying behaviour has three key features. It involves the intentional misuse of power in a relationship. It is ongoing and repeated, and it involves behaviours that can cause harm. The NSW Department of Education requires all NSW public schools to have an Anti-bullying Plan which details the strategies implemented to reduce student bullying behaviours.

Resources

The NSW anti-bullying website (see: https://antibullying.nsw.gov.au/) provides evidence-based resources and information for schools, parents and carers, and students. Schools are encouraged to visit the website to support whole-school prevention, early intervention and response approaches and strategies for student bullying behaviour.

Colo High School's commitment

Our school rejects all forms of bullying behaviours, including online (or cyber) bullying by maintaining a commitment to providing a safe, inclusive and respectful learning community that promotes student wellbeing. Executive staff are committed to establishing evidence-based approaches and strategies that promote a positive climate where bullying is less likely to occur.

1 School culture and inclusion

All members of the school community are active participants in building a welcoming school culture that values diversity and fosters positive relationships. A key component of a supportive school culture is building respectful relationships and an ethos that bullying is not accepted, in both online and offline environments. School staff will actively respond to student bullying behaviour.

Our school engages in the following practices to promote a positive school culture.

1.1 Student assemblies

Student bullying and expectations about student behaviour will be discussed and information presented to promote a positive school culture where bullying is not accepted.

1.3 New and casual staff

New and casual staff will be informed about our school's approaches and strategies to prevent and respond to student bullying behaviour in the following ways.

- information is provided in a handout to staff when they enter on duty at the school
- an executive staff member speaks to new and casual staff when they enter on duty at the school
- the principal speaks to new executive staff when they enter on duty at the school, as part of the induction process

ALL Staff (existing, new and casual) are stakeholders in student wellbeing and Colo High's expectation is that all staff identify, report, respond and support any incidences of bullying that occurs in their class or within their duty of care. Please see the "Follow-Up of Bullying" plan distributed to all staff annually.

2 Partnerships with families and community

Effective schools have high levels of parental and community involvement. This involvement is strongly related to improved student learning, attendance and behaviour. Our school proactively builds collaborative relationships with families and communities to create a shared understanding of how to support student learning, safety and wellbeing.

2.1 Website

Our school website has information to support families help their children to regulate their emotions and behaviour and develop socially. Information is provided to assist if children have been involved in bullying behaviour (as the person engaging in bullying behaviour, as the person being bullied or as the person witnessing the bullying behaviour).

^{*}Day to day operations of the entire Colo High School Staff and also the Wellbeing team, to be accessible to students and families & support reporting and follow up of bullying behaviours.

^{*}Weekly Year Meetings/Assemblies - addressing resilience, positive student behaviour, role modelling & school citizenship.

^{* &}quot;Upstanding behaviour" program where Wellbeing Team encourages students to report bullying behaviour and not condone it through bystander behaviour. Positive approach to acknowledge the students who actively support peers in difficult situations.

^{*}Weekly Whole School Assemblies - updating students on current and changes to support services, including accessing School Counsellor Team

^{*}Tell them from Me Survey - students have private access to identifying behaviours or students who cause concern
